- Inspect external doors and garage doors. Install weather-stripping, door thresholds if needed.
- Wash exterior windows.
- Drain and store garden hoses. Install insulating covers on exterior spigots. Have sprinkler systems blown free of water.
- Check gutters and downspouts. Clear away debris if necessary.
- Have chimneys and flues inspected and cleaned if necessary.

Water damage ... Is it safe to stay in your house?



Your primary focus should be safety first.

Only do activities that are safe for you to perform.

Wet materials can be VERY heavy. Be careful!!

Electrical and "slip & fall" hazards are the most prevalent concerns.

After any water damage situation here are a few tips to protect belongings:

- Remove excess water by mopping and blotting.
- Wipe excess water from wood furniture after removing lamps and tabletop items.
- Remove and prop wet upholstery and cushions.
- Place aluminum foil or wood blocks between furniture legs and wet carpeting.
- Turn air conditioning on for maximum drying in summer.
- Remove colored rugs from wet carpeting.
- Remove art objects to a safe, dry place.
- Gather loose items from floors.
- Don't leave wet fabrics in place. Hang furs and leather goods.
- Don't leave books, magazines or other colored items on wet carpet or floors.
- Don't use your household vacuum to remove water.
- Don't use television or other household appliances.
- Don't turn on ceiling fixtures if ceiling is wet, and keep out of rooms where ceilings are sagging.
